The government announced there were 6.05 million ambulance dispatches in 2015, reaching a record high for 6 years in a row. As Japanese society is aging, the numbers are expected to keep rising.

The government data shows about half the people who used ambulances were not seriously ill. Some of them called an ambulance just because it's quick and free of charge.

If nothing is done, it won't be possible to sustain the services financially and there will be delays in providing emergency help. An *advisory panel to the finance minister suggested charging money to use an ambulance for small medical problems, citing examples of overseas fees. But opponents argue some people may fear the cost and put their lives at risk.

It is uncertain whether the proposal will become law.

In Japan, there's a clear distinction between being a student and being a member of society. Students devote themselves to their studies at school while members of society go out to work. Things are (X) in North America. In Canada and the United States, students are encouraged to get part-time jobs, often beginning in elementary school.

My first part-time job was delivering newspapers. I started when I was 9 years old. Each morning, I got up at 6 a.m. to pick up newspapers from the delivery office, then delivered them by bicycle to **(1) subscribers** in the neighborhood. If everything went well, I finished just in time to grab some breakfast then head to school. The work was often hard – delivering newspapers in the rain, sweating in the summer heat or struggling through snow in winter. First, I'd arrive at the family's house and get instructions from the parents. Next, I'd play with the kids for a few hours. After that, I'd put them to bed and spend the rest of the evening watching TV or doing homework. It was a big responsibility to look after another family's children but it felt (Z) to be trusted and to help parents enjoy a night out.

Another job I had as a boy was mowing lawns. All the houses in our neighborhood had grass which needed regular cutting. My brother and I often spent weekends mowing lawns for extra cash.

North Americans believe that part-time jobs provide valuable experience for children, promote responsibility and train young people for the world of work. I know my part-time jobs certainly **(2) benefited me**.
