Like most people, I love a good story, and soon after I came to Japan, I heard many Japanese folktales. These tales are great. In some ways, they're like American tales. But in some ways they are very different.

The first Japanese tale I heard was (1). An old couple had no child and wanted one. Many Western tales begin in the same way. Even now, in the 21st (2), many people who hope for children cannot have them. But the way this grandmother and grandfather get their child is really original.

My first question is why is a peach floating down the river? Surely it would be much more natural to find a peach in a peach orchard. Is the river important as (3)? For example, maybe the river symbolizes the rush of life. You may get one moment to grab your chance, so you must be awake to life's (4). This is a nice idea, but... I probably worry about realism too much. After all, (1) is clearly fiction. But I think that if it's going to be something in a river, a fish would be more believable.

Also, why a peach and not some other fruit? Peaches are a very delicate fruit. It's a wonder that poor (1) isn't completely bruised by the time the old woman finds him. I understand that the peach is unusually big. (5) But I can't help thinking that a watermelon would have been a much better choice. Then, after (1) survives his river journey, the old woman eagerly cuts into the peach with her knife! Poor (1) again! How lucky again to survive! Peaches are actually my favorite kind of fruit and it's lucky for (1) that I wasn't that old woman. [6]
